SURVIVORS FEAR ROUND 2

TILL AUGUST 5, 2,90,343 PATIENTS RECOVERED FROM THE VIRUS, OF WHICH MERELY 0.42 PER CENT DONATED PLASMA IN MAHARASHTRA

"If I donate plasma, it will make me weak. I do not want to set foot in a hospital again. It will remind me of the month I spent in the hospital after testing positive for COVID-19," is a common reply health officials are met with to a call for plasma donation. Despite being one of the most successful treatments for the virus, calls for convalescent plasma donation have failed to even elicit a lukewarm response in Maharashtra. Only 0.42 per cent of the 2,90,343 patients recovered have come forward to donate to this cause. Health officials have attributed this to stigma, fear of re-contacting the infection and lack of awareness on the subject.

According to the data provided by the Food And Drugs Administration (FDA), till August 5, only 1,236 units of plasma were donated for convalescent plasma therapy, of which 823 units have been utilised. Moreover, only 395 units of plasma are left.


All these donations have been

recorded in the seven divisions of the state, which includes Greater Mumbai, Konkan (Thane, Raigad and Palghar), Nashik, Aurangabad, Pune, Nagpur and Amravati. The highest number of donations has been done in Mumbai division (662 units), followed by Pune (378), Aurangabad (46), Nagpur (44), Nashik (40), Konkan (34) and Amravati (32).

Till August 5, 2,90,343 patients recovered from COVID-19 in the seven divisions of the state. However, mere 0.42 per cent of the recovered patients opted for the noble cause. The actual number of donors can be far lesser, as the data provided by FDA also includes donors who have donated more than once.

"Recovered COVID-19 patients do not want to recall their past, due to which they fear coming forward as they are still not mentally prepared to do so. It is also learned that most of the patients provide wrong numbers so that we do not bother them," said Dr Mohan Joshi, in-charge of BYL Nair Hospital.

Death toll at 19K

The COVID-19 death toll in Maharashtra has crossed the 19,000 mark, with 413 fatalities being recorded on Thursday, taking the total number to 19,063. It is the highest single-day death reported so far. Meanwhile, the state also added 11,813 new cases, taking the total count to 5,60,126 until now. Of the 413 deaths, 288 were from the last 48 hours, 74 from the last week, and 51 from the period before last week. Of the total deaths, 149 were from the Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), followed by 118 in Pune, 44 in Nashik, 49 in Kolhapur, 27 in Latur, 18 in Nagpur, nine in Akola and eight in Aurangabad.

Even as the case fatality rate (CFR) is gradually reducing, the absolute number of deaths reported daily is on the higher side. In August, so far, the state has reported 3,676 fatalities. State officials said the CFR of Maharashtra will be under 2 per cent within a month. The CFR of the state stood at 3.4 per cent, as on August 13. "One will have to have patience. All efforts are being

taken, but the results will appear after some time. If you see, the death rate has come down from the past three months. It will come down further with better infrastructure being created and better management. Our goal is to bring it below 1 per cent. Within a month or so, we will reach [between] 1.5 per cent and 2 per cent [CFR]," he said.

According to the public health department of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation, the city reported 1,200 cases and 48 deaths on Thursday, taking the total count to 1,27,571 with 6,988 deaths so far.

In the past two months, Maharashtra has witnessed a shift in the pattern of the spread of the virus from largely being concentrated in urban areas to semi-urban centres and rural parts of Maharashtra. Since the outbreak in March, the spread of the virus was largely limited to Mumbai, Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), Pune, Pimpri-Chinchwad and Pune rural, and parts of Nashik district. There were sporadic cases in other parts of the state, but it had not shot up.

Ridge Rd repairs to take 2 months

The stretch between Kemps Corner and RTI junction in south Mumbai that faced the onslaught of the recent torrential rains and the resultant landslide is likely to remain shut for two months, said the traffic police. The BMC is yet to inform the police as to how long the road needs to be shut completely or opened partially for vehicles. The traffic police suggest motorists opt for the diversions. According to sources, it is highly dangerous to drive through the stretch that saw the collapse of a retaining wall near the Hanging Gardens due to a landslide. The landslide developed cracks on BG Kher Road. Boulders and soil are still sliding down the stretch. Motorists travelling from the western suburbs to south Mumbai can use the west-east connectors, then take BA Road and JJ flyover. Another diversion suggested was to take the Bandra-Worli Sealink-Mahalaxmi Junction-BD Road-Stephen Church towards Malabar Hill.
